




OTHER SUMMER SUNDAY CLASSES:

SESSION NOTES

From the Session, May 28, 2009

At its stated May meeting the Session took a number of actions to prepare Westminster Church for our next pastor.

After presentation by the Mission Study Committee, the Session unanimously adopted the report which had been in process since the Committee, chaired by Ashby Burks, was appointed last December. Copies of this report are available on the website, www.nashvillewpc.org/News and Events/Mission Study Committee. The report is being used by the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) to write the Church Information Form. The Session thanked the committee enthusiastically for its work.

The Session accepted with thanksgiving a bequest from the estate of Adelaide Hohanness for \$241,393.00. Upon a motion from the Finance Sub-Committee, and after careful

discussion, the Session agreed to use the bequest to repay the internal Westminster Building Debt Fund which had been used to fund major renovation of these facilities completed in 1998. Balance owing to the Building Debt Fund is \$241,141.00

Growing out of that action, the Moderator and Clerk were asked to appoint a committee to recommend to the Session an appropriate way to honor the memory of Mrs. Hohanness in appreciation for the bequest, as well as for her love for and commitment to this church over a lifetime.

The Session received with gratitude a report by James Fields and Jennifer Bottorff from the Westminster School for Young Children. The report listed in some detail the eight objectives agreed to by the board of the school and the Session when the Session reaffirmed that the school is a mission of this congregation to the young children of Nashville and their families. Two of the objectives which were accomplished were the combining of the boards of the two schools, and a successful fund drive for the renovation of two playgrounds used by the children.

The Session was advised by the vice-chair of the Pastor Nominating Committee, Tom Wylly, that the PNC is hard at work writing the Church Information Form which it expects to bring to the June Session meeting for approval.

2010 Stewardship Campaign



JULIE AND TOM WILSON TO LEAD 2010 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

We are both excited and grateful for the opportunity to lead the 2010 Stewardship Campaign at Westminster.

Westminster has meant a lot to us both spiritually and personally. On a personal level, we met at Westminster in a Sunday School class, were later married at Westminster, and baptized our daughter Ferrell at Westminster.

On a spiritual level, we both have grown in our faith at Westminster through worship, service and witness to our Lord Jesus Christ. In short, Westminster Presbyterian Church is very special to us.

Agreeing to serve as co-chairs for the 2010 Stewardship Campaign has already been enlightening for us. In the many conversations we have had about stewardship as a couple since agreeing to serve as stewardship co-chairs, we have discovered, somewhat surprisingly, that the reasons why we give to the church are more different than what we previously thought or assumed. We agree on what we give,

but why we give is different for each of us.

One thing we do agree on is the scriptural basis for this year's campaign. It comes from Jesus' Sermon On The Mount and is found in *Matthew 6:21...* "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

This particular passage really resonates with us. We have found that as we have committed more of our time, talent, and especially our treasure to the Church, and to Westminster in particular, our connection with the church has grown stronger.

One of our objectives for the 2010 Stewardship Campaign is to expand the conversation about financial stewardship at Westminster beyond the traditional 6-8 weeks in the fall. For something that is as important as financial stewardship is to the life and work of the church, we believe it should be a year-round conversation. While it likely cannot be accomplished in a single year, we hope for a day when conversations about stewardship at Westminster are as natural as those about Bible study and other matters of the church.

In an effort to begin that conversation, we commend to your reading this summer a book titled, *Creating Congregations of Generous People* by Michael Durall. This book really resonated with us, articulating and affirming many of the beliefs we have about financial stewardship and how mainline churches such as Westminster should approach what is such a vital part of Christian discipleship. You can order it through www.Amazon.com for \$14. It is an easy, yet engaging read, and we highly recommend it to everyone at Westminster.

Just two weeks ago at the May meeting of our Session, we handed out copies of the book to every member, as well as the pastoral staff, to read as a summer homework assignment. We hope to return at a future Session meeting to lead a discussion about the book.

Another objective for this year's stewardship campaign is to educate the congregation about the giving habits of the congregation and the needs of the church. It is our hope that by doing this the congregation will become more informed about the impact of each individual and family's giving on the financial sustainability of the church.

Rest assured that we will also have a financial goal for the congregation during this year's Stewardship Campaign. We pray that that goal will be God's call for Westminster Presbyterian Church.

Let us close by thanking you for this opportunity. We encourage and invite everyone to become engaged with each other in a heartfelt discussion about stewardship at Westminster.
